- Men, Women & Children:
- Men APPROVED APPAREL
 - Jeans, Slacks or Khakis (No holes or worn out looking jeans)
 - T-shirts are fine, though anyone preaching at a church service should wear a shirt with a collar at that time.
 - All clothing should be modest and free of any questionable designs.
- Women APPROVED APPAREL
 - o Skirts/Dresses (knee length) for ALL Church Services
 - o Pants (khakis)
 - Jeans (loose fitting nothing tight & no holes or worn out looking jeans)
 - Tops (sleeveless permitted, no "spaghetti straps," no low-cut or crop tops with stomach showing)

Showering in the Village - APPROVED APPAREL

• Moderate Shorts are allowed when walking to and from the showers or in sleeping areas.

Scrubs - Guidelines

- Scrubs are allowed in a church service, by medical professionals only, when you do not have time to change prior to the service.
- If pre-approved by your Team Captain, "scrubs" may be worn by those working in the clinics and the pharmacy during clinic hours.

Shoes & Outerwear

- Shoes should be chosen for comfort and suitability for walking on rough terrain; you may wish to bring two pair in case one pair gets wet as well as extra socks.
- Sweater or light jacket is recommended for cool nights.

Zamorano Mission House - Guidelines for Shorts

Enforcement of the Dress Code

- Team Captains are asked to review the dress code with team members prior to travel day.
- Distribute copies of this dress code to all Team Members. Be certain everyone on your team (youth and adults) understands what is required and what is prohibited before packing.
- Team Captains will be asked to enforce the dress code among team members when in country.
- If necessary, the Missionary in Charge will take appropriate action with the Team Captain to ensure that all Team Members follow the dress code.
- Violation of the dress code at any time will result in Team Members being asked to change their attire immediately.
- Team Members will not be allowed to work if not dressed according to the dress code

Please understand that we don't ask these things to be legalistic or to deprive you of your individuality. It's just that particular appearances don't say the same thing in Honduras as they might in the U.S. The people we are serving are looking at us from their cultural lens and point of view. We must not damage our impact by allowing material things to get in the way.
