TRAVEL INFORMATION:

- Air travel will be on American Airlines in and out of Memphis through Miami.
- Departure: 2/14/26 — MEM to MIA, #AA1442, 5:50am (CST) - 9:15am (EST)
— MIA to GUA, #AA2395, 12:05pm (EST) - 1:45pm (CST)
- Arrival: 2/20/26 — GUA to MIA, #AA1258, 2:05pm (CST) - 5:55pm (EST)
— MIA to MEM, #AA2537, 9:30pm (EST) - 11:14pm (CST)
- Valid passports are required with an expiration date **after** 8/21/2026

FEE & PAYMENT SCHEDULE

- For FBCOB members the total cost is \$1,500 per person.
- The total cost of the trip for people outside FBCOB is \$2,400 per person.
- This cost covers:
 - Commissioned International fee
 - Airline tickets with one checked bag each way
 - Lodging and meals while in Guatemala.
 - Cost of the construction material for the houses we will be building
 - Any other ministry-related expenses.

- Payment schedule:
 - All payments should be made through FBCOB or Borderless Brigade in person or online.
 - **Do not pay online through the Managed Mission site.**
 - A payment of \$650 is due on or before 1/6/26 (this is the date we must put names on airline ticket)
 - Remaining balance due before 2/14/2026

HEALTH AND SAFETY:

- You should have an up-to-date Tetanus vaccination.
- It is strongly recommended that you consult your health care provider for advice on and prescriptions of pre-trip Prophylactic antibiotics. We will also need to know of any known allergies to Cipro, Levaquin and Zithromax.
- The climate will be hot in February, and all team activities will be outdoors.
- The terrain is mountainous and rough.
- Be sure to pack insect repellant (*wipes are easiest to carry*) and sunscreen.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

- We will be staying at the team compound in La Libertad, Guatemala.
- This will be bunkroom type sleeping arrangements.
- There is a pool available at this facility.

DRESS CODE:

- Dress code is much more relaxed in Guatemala than for our Honduras trips, however modesty is always required.
- Knee length shorts are allowed for both men and ladies.
- Comfortable shoes well suited for rough terrain are recommended.
